The Lexden Crown has a long and colourful history having been a beerhouse since 1851 with the original building dating back to the 1600's.

Question: How many hanging baskets hang from the wall of The Lexden Crown?

Activity: If you were going to plant up a hanging basket outside your house, what would you like to plant in it? Talk about this on the way to our next location.

Welcome to Spring Lane Park, through this opening is a fantastic place for a picnic and to enjoy some time in the sunshine

Question: What is the road called that you can see through the tree line?

Activity: See who can run to the large tree on the other side of the field first

At the top of the hill take a break and look up and down the road at all the trees that line Lexden Road.

Question: What do trees produce that benefit us?

Activity: As part of the Queens Jubilee, she wants us all to plant a tree. What tree would you plant up in your garden? Talk about this on the way to our next spot.

You have found the cast iron drinking trough marked Walter Macfarlane and Co, Saracen Foundry, Glasgow. Macfarlane's were a prolific manufacturer of cast iron street furniture between 1849 and 1965.

Question: What was this trough used for?

Activity: Have you seen any of these around Colchester before? If so, where?

Question: How many trees are planted in this area?

Activity: Take a seat and listen, see if you can hear the birds around this area.
