- 5: Before you climb you may need a drink, but this place no longer has water
- 6: You will find the final point of this trail at the base of one of the tallest structures in town, which could also be the name of an elephant.

We are here on a roundabout, probably the best looking roundabout in Colchester that still has a place for some wildlife.

Question: What is the statue of in the middle of this roundabout?

Activity: Can you find any wildlife amongst the trees and plants here on the roundabout. What creepy crawlies or birds call this home? Stay to the path and please be careful near the road.

2

This is the Avenue of Remembrance.
The names listed here are from a Schedule of
Memorial and Commemorative tree plantings which
was published following the opening of the Avenue
of Remembrance in 1933.

Question: What year was the Great War?

Activity: Can you find the daisies that are growing in this area? How many can you count?

This is the anchor from the TS Colne Light that you may have seen at the Hythe. Presented in 1996 to The Seatrade Organisation by Colchester Sea Cadets

Question: How heavy is the anchor?

Activity: As you continue your adventure discuss what the Colne Light was used for and how the anchor ended up over this side of town.

This bridge takes you across part of the River Colne.

Question: What year did the bridge reopen after it had to be widened?

Activity: This is a great place to watch the ducks. Step away from the road and down the steps and see how many ducks you can spot.

5

This one was the toughest clues of them all. This is a drinking fountain here at Northgate, one of the six Roman gates in the town wall.

Question: Who Presented this water fountain?

Activity: There are a lot of twigs scattered across the floor. See if you can create art from the twigs
